February Webinar

Professor Simon Spooner, Principal Scientist, Atkins Infrastructure presented our February webinar titled "Preparing for Combustion Transition: A framework for accelerating our transition to Net Zero". His presentation offered a simpler view of carbon accounting by focusing on where the combustion of fossil fuels takes place and can be easily measured. As the efficiency of the combustion process can also be recorded this enables processes that are most inefficient to be prioritised for replacement enabling a more effective transition to net zero. April Webinar

Our next webinar will be presented by Allan Barton, Global Business Leader of Arup's resource and waste business at 5.30pm on Monday 17th April 2023. The subject will be "Sustainable Resources, Treasuring the planet's resources for the future: What you can do".
